ACE State Summary – Wyoming March 2019

Key Academic Findings

- A higher rate of ACE scholars are proficient at reading and math a higher proportion of ACE students are proficient in third-grade reading compared to their public school peers (ACE 73%, public school 51%). Likewise, a greater proportion of ACE students are proficient in math in the eighth grade compared to Wyoming eighth-graders (ACE 60%, Public School 52%).
- ACE schools report higher college matriculation rates than the state of Wyoming More students at ACE-affiliated schools went onto college (95%) approximately 41.2 points higher than the matriculation rate for the entire state of Wyoming.

Key Findings from Parents

- Academics and safety are driving factors for choice most ACE parents choose private schools due to the better academics (91.8%), the faith-based curriculum (87.8%), and the safer environment (85.7%). These were the top reasons why parents chose these schools (among the parents who selected these three reasons).
- Wyoming ACE parents cited access to teachers as another key reason for choosing schools approximately 83.7% of ACE parents cited access to teachers as a deciding factor for choosing these schools.
- ACE household income is half that of households with school-aged children Median annual household income in ACE households is approximately half of that of the average Wyoming household with school-aged children (ACE, \$38K compared to Wyoming, \$74K).

ACE-affiliated Building Findings

- ACE-affiliated schools are at 74.6% capacity exactly 568 seats at ACE-affiliated Wyoming schools are empty nearly one-fourth of all seats at these schools.
- Teacher and principal tenure are comparable to public school educators —On average teachers
 at ACE affiliated schools have seven years of experience, compared to nearly ten years for public
 school teachers.
